Many people with disabilities rely on a range of public programs, such as Social Security, Medicaid, Medicare, Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Programs (SNAP), and others that support their daily needs, health, and independence. They also benefit from programs that provide housing assistance, job training, special education, childcare, and developmental disability programs for support and services. What's more, many federal agencies enforce critical laws against disability discrimination, including the Americans with Disabilities Act. Here's what we want you to know. Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments will continue during a shutdown. While these critical needs will continue to be met, a prolonged shutdown could exacerbate ongoing customer service issues created by the underfunding of the Social Security Administration (SSA). Many people with disabilities need SSA's support in navigating benefits and already endure long wait times for disability determinations. Many of the other programs that people with disabilities rely on are administered by state governments, with critical oversight and administration conducted by the federal government The lack of this critical federal oversight could result in many more people with disabilities unjustly losing their Medicaid benefits.

There is also considerable concern about the impact of the childcare funding crisis resulting in tens of thousands of childcare centers potentially closing and millions of kids potentially losing this critical avenue for early development. This is happening because of the expiration of pandemic emergency relief funds that were used to support struggling daycare centers. Families already experience significant hardship finding childcare options for kids with disabilities, which could worsen without action by Congress.

Looking to the future, a government shutdown raises the potential for additional cuts to an already strained system. The Social Security Administration, for example, is facing a customer service crisis and programs like the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), which ensures students with a disability are given a free appropriate public education, have never been fully funded.

The reality is that funding for programs for people with disabilities needs to be significantly expanded, not cut. A government shutdown creates the political environment for cuts, going in the wrong direction for people with disabilities and their families.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS CEREMONY FOR THE DISPOSAL OF UNSERVICEABLE FLAGS

(All assemble near flagpole or other suitable location) (If music is used), (National Anthem) Honor Guard/Members salute/present swords.

Faithful Commander: Faithful Navigator, we wish to present a number of unserviceable Flags of our Country for inspection and disposal.

Faithful Navigator: Faithful Commander advance with your detail and present the Flags for disposal and inspection.

(Faithful Commander calls his detail to attention. They form at the Post of the Commander then march with two of the Flags which are to be inspected to the Faithful Pilot. The Faithful Commander steps one pace forward and salutes with sword). *Faithful Commander:* Faithful Pilot, we present these unserviceable

Flags for your inspection.

Faithful Pilot: Is the present condition of these Flags the result of their usual service as the Emblem of our Country. Faithful Commander: These Flags have become faded and worn over the graves of our departed comrades and the soldier, sailor and airmen dead of all our nation's wars. (Pilot opens and inspects one or two flags).

Faithful Pilot: Present these Flags to the Faithful Admiral for his inspection. (The Faithful Commander salutes with sword, about faces, commands the detail) About Face, (crosses behind the detail and takes his post at its left, commands) Forward March. (The detail marches to within two paces of the Faithful Admiral, halts and proceeds as before.)

Faithful Commander: Faithful Admiral, we present these Flags which have been inspected by the Faithful Pilot, for your further inspection. (Admiral opens and inspects one or two flags).

Faithful Admiral: Have any of these Flags served any other purpose?

Faithful Commander: Some of these Flags have been displayed

in various public places.

Faithful Admiral: Present them to the Faithful Navigator for final inspection and fitting disposal.

(The Faithful Commander salutes with sword, about faces, commands the detail), About Face, (Crosses behind the detail and takes position on its left commands), Forward March. (The detail marches to center, turns right, halts within two paces of the Faithful Navigator, Faithful Commander steps one pace forward and salutes with sword.)

Faithful Commander: Faithful Navigator, we have the honor

to present for fi al inspection and proper disposal these Flags of our Country.

Faithful Navigator: Have these Flags been inspected by the Faithful Pilot and Faithful Admiral?

Faithful Commander: They Have.

Faithful Navigator: Faithful Pilot, what does your inspection show and what do you recommend?

Faithful Pilot: Faithful Navigator, I have inspected these flags and all the flags on the table. Since these Flags have become unserviceable in a worthy cause, I recommend that they be honorably retired from further Service.

Faithful Navigator: Faithful Admiral, what does your inspection

show and what do you recommend?

Faithful Admiral: Faithful Navigator, I too have inspected all these flags. Since these Flags have become faded and worn in a tribute of service and love, I also recommend that they be fittingly destroyed.

Faithful Navigator: Sir Knights, we have presented here these Flags of our Country which have been inspected and condemned as unserviceable. They have reached their present state in a proper service of tribute, memory and love.

A Flag may be a flimsy bit of printed gauze, or a beautiful banner of fi nest silk. Its intrinsic value may be trifling or great; but its real value is beyond price, for it is a precious symbol of all that we and our comrades have worked for and lived for, and died for a free Nation of free men, true to the faith of the past, devoted to the ideals and practice of Justice, Freedom and Democracy.

Let these faded Flags of our Country be retired and destroyed with respectful and honorable rites and their places, be taken by bright new Flags of the same size and kind, and let no grave of our soldier, sailor or airman dead be un-honored or unmarked. Faithful Commander, assembles the Color Guard, escort the detail bearing the Flags and destroy these Flags by burning. The members shall stand at attention.

Faithful Navigator: The Commander (or Chaplain) will offer prayer.

Commander (or Chaplain): Almighty God, Captain of all hosts and Commander over all, bless and consecrate this present hour. We thank Thee for our Country and its Flag, and for the liberty for which it stands. To clean and purging flame we commit these Flags, worn-out in worthy Service. As they yield their substance to the fire, may Thy Holy Light spread Country. Amen.

Faithful Navigator: Hand salute / Present Swords.

(Color Guards present arms. All officers and members except those on the flag detail salute. Members of the Flag detail dips two or three of the condemned Flags in kerosene and place them of the rack over the fi re).

I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands One Nation, Under God, with liberty and justice for all.

Faithful Navigator: I thank all for attending this Flag Disposal Ceremony. Dismissed.
