Then begins All Saints' Day followed by All Souls' Day. Something I might suggest that you and your councils participate in for November is to do what my (St. Ann in Florence) Legion of Mary does, we go to a cemetery once a week and pray the Rosary for the souls of the faithfully departed Catholics that are laid to rest in that cemetery. There are four weeks in November, so we visit four different cemeteries in the month of November, one per week on Tuesdays. We even have a parishioner or two that join us for this solemn, holy occasion.

Speaking of the Rosary, October is the Month of the Most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Last month, I outlined for you the Seven Sorrows of Mary Rosary, as September was the Month of the Seven Sorrows of Mary. As September honored the Seven Sorrows of Mary, we learned that our sorrowful Mother could teach us much about the sanctity of suffering and be a source of consolation to us in our own suffering and trials. We learned how to call upon our perfect Mother, who desires to comfort us and to point us to her Son.

In this month's article, I would like to share the Seven Promises of the Seven Sorrows of Mary. Through St. Bridget of Sweden, Mary made these Seven Promises to those who are devoted to meditating on her Seven Sorrows: 1.) I will grant peace to their families; 2.) They will be enlightened about the divine mysteries; 3.) I will console them in their pains, and I will accompany them in their work; 4.) I will give them as much as they ask for as long as it does not oppose the adorable will of my Divine Son or the sanctification of their souls; 5.)

When our Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly asked us to join him in a day of fasting and prayer, for all those suffering due to the conflicts in the Middle East, in solidarity with

Cardinal Pierbattista Pizzabella on October 17, he reminded us that "Together in prayer, we can beg Christ's mercy and peace upon all who are suffering."

At the beginning of this Fraternal Year, I introduced a theme: Zeal to Further. I shared that zeal is a strong, action-oriented

desire to advance in the spiritual life; that it puts love of Christ, the love of the Eucharist, into action. This was followed by a challenge to spend an extra five minutes a day each week in prayer to symbolize this love of Christ and then see where you will go from there. "This world is no place for Catholic Chickens." -- Mother Angelica God and the Devil Are in Conflict

In the Bible, the Gospel of Matthew offers a glimpse behind the scenes of the conflict between these two kingdoms:

They brought him a demon-possessed man who was blind and mute, and Jesus healed him, so that he could both talk and see. All the people were astonished and said, "Could this be the Son of David?" (Matthew 12:22–24,)

In response to Jesus freeing the man from his demon and healing his blindness and muteness, a group of Pharisees accuse Jesus of using Satan's power to drive out demons. They say He is trying to fool people into following Him. **But Jesus answers them**:

"Every kingdom divided against itself will be ruined, and every city or household divided against itself will not stand. If Satan drives out Satan, he is divided against himself. How then can his kingdom stand? And if I drive out demons by Beelzebul, by whom do your people drive them out? So then, they will be your judges. But if it is by the Spirit of God that I drive out demons, then the kingdom of God has come upon you. "Whoever is not with Me is against Me, and whoever does not gather with Me scatters." (Matthew 12:25–30,) There's a lot at stake in this conflict, and **Satan isn't playing games**. The very fact that Jesus is casting out demons should be seen as a confirmation of His message that the kingdom of God has come.

Then Jesus lays out a fundamental truth: **There are no sidelines in this war. The kingdom of God has come, and we're either with Jesus or against Him**. There are a million ways to oppose Jesus' work in the world, but those who are with Him are focused on the same goal: building His kingdom by both knowing and following Him and by helping others to know him too.

Into the breach: An Apostolic Exhortation to Catholic Men Puts it this way:

"We must attack Satan. We don't sit back and just try to ward him off, but we go forward with our faith. We put on the armor of God, and every single day try to slay that dragon."

The fourth degree of the Knights of Columbus say it like this:

We're all on a journey, We're all on a mission. As Catholic men and men of integrity, our mission is to share

From the State Protocol Chairman

Worthy Grand Knights, Faithful Navigators and Members of the State Council:

Marks of Respect for the Flag of the United States • The National Flag should be flown daily from sunrise to sunset in good weather from public buildings, schools, permanent staff s in the open and near polling places on election days. The flag should not be displayed on days when the weather is inclement, except when an all-weather flag is displayed. The flag may be displayed twenty-four hours a day if properly illuminated during the hours of darkness.

• The flag should always be flown on national and state holidays and on those occasions proclaimed by the President. On Memorial Day, the Ensign shall be half staffed until noon.

• The flag should be hoisted briskly and lowered ceremoniously.

It should never be dipped to any person

or thing nor should it ever be displayed with the union down except as a signal of dire distress.

• The flag should never be allowed to touch anything beneath it, nor should it ever be carried flat or horizontally –always aloft and free.

• It should never be used as drapery or decoration, for carrying or holding anything, or stored in such a manner that it will be damaged or soiled.

• The flag should never be used for advertising purposes in anymanner whatsoever, nor should any picture, drawing, insignia or other decoration be placed upon should not be embroidered on personal items nor printed on anything designed for temporary use and then discarded.

• When the flag is so worn or soiled that it is no longer suitable for display, it should be destroyed in a dignified manner, preferably by burning.

• For rules on Posting the Colors, please refer to the Patriotic Degree ceremonial book.

Next month I will have the Ceremony for Disposal of the U.S. Flag.


